ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING (RENEWAL)

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has determined that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county continue to create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Stephens County that all outdoor burning is banned in the unincorporated area of the county to begin immediately, October 13, 2025, for 90 days from the adoption of this Order, the same being January 11, 2026, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court.

This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081 and other applicable statutes.

This Order does **not** prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, including:

- 1. Firefighter training;
- 2. Public utility, natural gas pipeline, or mining operations; or
- 3. Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or
- 4. Burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under §153.048, Texas Natural Resources Code, and meeting the standards of §153.047, Texas Natural Resources Code.

Additional Safety Requirements

1. Spotter Requirement:

Any person performing work that involves an open flame, welding, cutting torch, or similar equipment shall have a **dedicated spotter** on site whose sole responsibility is to supervise the work area for fire hazards and ensure safety measures are in place.

2. Water Source:

A minimum of **50 gallons of water** must be immediately available at the work site. The water shall be equipped with an adequate dispensing mechanism, such as a **pump and hose**, to enable rapid suppression of any fire.

3. Notification to Authorities:

Prior to engaging in any open flame or hot work activity, the responsible party must **notify the Breckenridge Fire Department** of the activity location by calling (254) 559-6242.

The County Judge may rescind this Order upon a determination that the circumstances requiring it no longer exist.

In accordance with Local Government Code §352.081(h), a violation of this Order constitutes a **Class C misdemeanor**, punishable by a fine not to exceed **\$500.00**.

ADOPTED this 13th day of October, 2025, by vote of the Stephens County Commissioners Court.

THIS RENEWED BURN BAN SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON ADOPTION.
